Why does God's Kingdom way of doing things want to invade the entirety of your being and not just your spiritual life?

Are there areas of your life that you are curating apart from the Kingdom?

Hey... Wait! (Matt. 13:33; Lev. 2:4-5)

What does Jesus use as a symbol for the Kingdom in this verse?

Why was it strange for Jesus to make this analogy (see Lev. 2:4-5)?

Why do you think yeast was forbidden in worship to God? How is it a good analogy for sin?

Why does Jesus seem to consistently use "evil" as a parable for "good"?
