


## ENDER 2057. LEVITIENS 19:12

We are the kind of people who should be learning to live as authentically and truthfully as possible. Sharing our whole selves. Our stories, our insecurities and fears. Helping people to see beyond the surface. Learning to avoid spin and speaking truth plainly. Non-judgmentally listening and loving others when they share theirs.

If we don't learn authenticity, the consequences can be HUGE:

1. Anxiety and depression.

2. Lack of connection with God and with others.

3. Self-doubt (not knowing the true you) and regret.

4. Difficultly forming and maintaining relationships.
